2. Contact was also made with [redacted] in Mullerhof. He knows people in Arnstein, who are familiar with the Rhine between Arnstein and Blobstein. These people are fishermen and Service des Eaux Forests. An appointment has been made with him on 23 December.

3. Went to the holding area in Marmoutier to get Robert in contact with Max and Fritz. Robert is still in conference with them. He confirms our opinion that they are only interested in politics, but both parties seem to enjoy the gabbing, and Max and Fritz are getting a lot of information from Robert, which was Henry's aim in sending them up here.

4. Pfc Dally is taking over the operational supply store-room, now that Lt. Parsons has gone off. He is getting the "NOAH" packing into shape, and he has already efficiently made out the inventory.

5. The Kindl engineering documents have been sent to Lt Carre, 7th Army.
