

MULHOUSE REPORT

(B)(1) 23 December 1944

We proceeded with [redacted] and agent [redacted] to Heimersdorf in the Altkirch region on the 20th inst. She was able to pick up addresses of safe houses which had been requested upon our last visit, also her identity papers.

With [redacted] we tried to see Cpt. RIEGEL at the Sous-Prefecture, Room 15, as he was Chief of Resistance at Mulhouse and could have given us information concerning the Gestapo man.

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[redacted] we learnt that the Gestapo man was named Mr. BRENNER and that he was employed by the French Securite Militaire. We nevertheless tried to see him at his personal home, 40 Avenue Modenheim; unfortunately he was not in. he is reported as an Austrian of high class and [redacted] who is known to us as a reliable subject, will see him during our absence, to find out the possibilities on his side not for him personally of course but for some of his contacts.

[redacted] also knows two women whom she reports as being good subjects. She has not however been able to contact them. One is an Alsatian woman, the other an Austrian. We will attend to this matter after January 1st.

[redacted] but at the Hotel du Parc where he lives. we were informed that he would be in Paris with his wife until January 8th. This information might be conveyed to Henry Hyde who knows where to reach him at his office.

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We brought back to Station "P" [redacted] (see questionnaire #16). She appears to be a first class person and entirely qualified for the work we want her to do, but security will have to be further checked. She was introduced to us by Cpt. DUNGLER.

We were unable to see Cpt. DUNGLER who was reported to be in Strasbourg, but we left a note at his office saying that he should not fail to get in touch with us through 7th Army upon his next visit.
