Reference is made to your Bureau investigative report of 25 April 1951, New York City, on Vassili Vasilievich Soukhomline.

Page 36 of the above investigative report contains information that a Confidential Informant advised that on 31 May 1945 one Carl Green inquired of Beatrice Heiman, who was then employed by Overseas News Agency, concerning a person named Abraham Herenroth. Green indicated that Herenroth was connected with the Armed Services Forces, War Department, 165 Broadway, New York City, and was with the Overseas News Agency. Green further stated that from July 1939 to July 1941 Herenroth had been the foreign correspondent in Paris and Vichy, France, for Overseas News Agency, and from 1928 to 1941 had been chief correspondent in France for the Jewish Telegraphic Agency. Green further advised that Herenroth was born in Kiev, Russia in 1902, had arrived in the United States in September 1941, and that Herenroth obviously worked for the Overseas News Agency, although Heiman stated she had never heard of Herenroth.




