Dear Mr. Dulles,

For many years both your late brother Dr. John Foster Dulles and your good self have steadily supported us in our national endeavors. It was largely this support, plus the kind concern which underlies it, that has enabled the Republic of China to withstand the early crises and to move into the present state of confidence and hopefulness. Both I and the Chinese Government are deeply indebted to you two. Today, though you are about to retire from your official responsibilities, your staunch opposition to Communism and your warm friendship for China will be long remembered by the Chinese Government and people.

You are no doubt aware of the fact that the principal source of Communist threat to the free world today is the Chinese mainland and that only by solving the problem of the Chinese mainland can solutions for other problems of the world be found. The visit would give you an opportunity to study the latest developments in the struggle between freedom and slavery in Asia and at the same time give us an opportunity to exchange views with
