





ANGOLA-PORTUGAL

■ The Angolan government has broken diplomatic relations with Portugal and ordered all Portuguese diplomatic personnel to leave the country.

█ Late last month, Luanda closed its main offices in Lisbon and threatened to break relations unless certain demands were met. These demands still have not been made public, but they doubtless included insistence on Portuguese measures to prevent a recurrence of the recent bombing of the Angolan office in the northern Portuguese city of Porto.

█ Portuguese Foreign Minister Antunes, perhaps with the bombing in mind, blames rightists in Portugal for the current poor relations between Lisbon and Luanda. The Angolan decision may have been influenced by several articles in the Portuguese press critical of Angola.

█ Angola earlier this month nationalized a number of Portuguese companies in Angola on grounds they had been abandoned by their Portuguese managers. █
