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1. About the middle of 1960 the first members of the Movimiento Revolucionario 30 de Noviembre (Revolutionary Movement 30th of November), who were Cesar Blanco, Orlando Rodriguez, and Jesus Fernandez, arrived in Miami. However, it was not until early 1961 that the 30th of November Group in Exile was organized. Carlos Rodriguez Quesada (aka "Atilano") arrived from Cuba at this time and had the title of General Coordinator.
2. It is the general understanding in Cuba that the "mother" organizations are in Cuba and that the representatives in exile are here solely to procure funds and arms for the "mother" organizations. These organizations in exile remain under the orders of the "mother" organizations in Cuba.
3. With the consent of its "mother" organization, called Direccion Nacional (National Directorate), the 30th of November group in exile was allowed

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to join the Consejo Revolucionario (Revolutionary Council) under Dr. Jose ~~Quirque~~ ^{Quirque} Cardona. Orlando Rodriguez and Jesus Fernandez were named as delegates to the council.

Rodriguez Quesada (the General Coordinator) had been accused before the National Directorate, by Orlando Rodriguez and Jesus Fernandez, of laxity and failing to fulfill his duties as General Coordinator. The 30th of November group in La Cabana drew up a resolution and/or document designating Joaquin ~~Torres~~ ^{Torres} as new General Coordinator in exile, naming Orlando Rodriguez and Jesus Fernandez as permanent members and/or delegates to the Cuban Revolutionary Council, and demoting Carlos Rodriguez Quesada to Coordinator for the Workers, Professionals, and Students Sections. This document was not accepted as valid by the Cuban Revolutionary Council because it was not signed by the complete membership of the National Directorate of the 30th of November in Cuba. It was signed only by David ~~Salvador~~ ^{Salvador}.

A girl was designated to get the signatures of the other members but she failed to do so, and the document was received as such in Miami.

5. Another document was made, this time signed by the full membership of the National Directorate. It named Jose ~~Gomez~~ ^{Gomez} as General Coordinator (now a member of JURE), Orlando Rodriguez and Jesus Fernandez as permanent delegates to the Cuban Revolutionary Council, and Carlos Rodriguez Quesada as Secretary of Public Relations. This document was sent to the US through Spain and was never received in Miami. Consequently, Carlos Rodriguez Quesada still remained as General Coordinator.
6. About March 1962, a letter was received in Cuba by the National Directorate from Carlos Rodriguez Quesada explaining he had been expelled by the Cuban Revolutionary Council for leading a hunger strike, or something similar, at Bayfront Park in Miami. At this moment, the 30th of November group in exile split into two factions. Orlando Rodriguez and Jesus Fernandez formed a new executive committee and united themselves with the Cuban Revolutionary Council. Carlos Rodriguez Quesada took his executive group out of the Cuban Revolutionary Council and maintained his group intact. Thus, now there were two organizations called 30th of November in exile.
7. Upon hearing this, the National Directorate met in Havana to unite these two factions. They substituted the two delegates from the 30th of November group in the Cuban Revolutionary Council with five delegates having equal authority. They designated the Direccion Colegiada Integrada (Integrated Collegiate Directorate), consisting of Carlos Rodriguez Quesada, Orlando Rodriguez, Jesus Fernandez, Dr. (fnu) Anderson, and Jose Gomez. This document arrived in April 1962 signed by the full membership of the National Directorate, but was not accepted by the 30th of November faction of Orlando Rodriguez and Jesus Fernandez.
8. When the two 30th of November factions are not in accord, the orders from Cuba are not carried out. Orlando Rodriguez and Jesus Fernandez sent a document to Cuba saying that they could not accept an Integrated Collegiate Directorate with Carlos Rodriguez Quesada in it.
9. The National Directorate met on or about June 1962 again and passed three rulings.
 - a. To substitute Carlos Rodriguez Quesada in the Integrated Collegiate Directorate with Dr. Antonio ~~Gonzalez~~ ^{Gonzalez}, a CPA.
 - b. To upgrade the entries from the 30th of November in the Cuban Revolutionary Council in accord with the majority rule of the Junta.

Nacional Revolucionaria which had been formed in Cuba. This group was dissolved in August 1962 when it failed in a general uprising and Col (fnu) Margolles and 200 others were executed.

c. In case these two agreements cannot be complied with, then give full powers to Aurelio Fernandez to form a new executive committee which would be the only legitimate 30th of November group in exile. Cuba- FIA

10. This document was not complied with. Aurelio Fernandez was tired of it all, and within two months resigned from the 30th of November and joined up with JURE. He was the last officially recognized head of the 30th of November group in exile. The two groups and/or factions of Carlos Rodriguez Quesada and Orlando Rodriguez and Jesus Fernandez ceased to be recognized by the National Directorate of the 30th of November in Cuba. This left the 30th of November Movement without a legal representative in exile.

Carlos Rodriguez Quesada broke off entirely and formed a new independent group called "Movimiento Revolucionario Frank Pais" (Revolutionary Movement Frank Pais). Orlando Rodriguez, Jesus Fernandez, and Osvaldo Betancourt FIA

[REDACTED] decided to continue their executive committee and retain its name as the 30th of November group in exile, even though not sanctioned by the National Directorate in Cuba.

12. A few days ago an article appeared in the newspaper Diario de las Americas in Miami listing the executive committee of the un-sanctioned and unofficial 30 November group in exile. Luis Boreno appeared as the General Coordinator instead of Orlando Rodriguez or Jesus Fernandez. (411)

15. The new Executive Committee of the 30 November Movement in Exile was formed in Miami, Fla, on 12 Aug 63.
