1. On 29 May 1964 Rolando Arcadio Masferrer Rojas, a Cuban exile leader, held a meeting attended by the following persons:

2. During the meeting Masferrer said that within the next 60 days there would be a revolt in the ranks of Castro's forces and that anti-Castro groups would become active inside and outside Cuba. Masferrer said that

[REDACTED] would play an important role in the events that were to transpire during that time. Masferrer did not elaborate on how the revolt would come about, but said that an uprising would be possible because the persons participating in the revolt would have access to weapons and ammunition already cached in Cuba.

2. On 4 June 1964 [REDACTED] had [REDACTED] the signatures of several Cuban exile leaders, which he intended to submit to the Immigration and Naturalization Service in Miami in early June 1964 with a request for Masferrer's legal return to Miami.

- 4. Masferrer arrived in Miami on 27 May with a quantity of arms and ammunition which he plans to use against Castro.

[REDACTED]

- 5. As of 22 May, Masferrer was alleged to have enough equipment in Miami to arm about 200 men. This equipment was to be moved from the United States mainland to an unidentified key where it would be buried. About 200 men were to proceed to the key, arm themselves with the cached materiel, and proceed to Cuba when the fighting began there so that they could also claim to be the liberators of Cuba.
