Burundi-Rwanda: Ethnic Violence Increasing

Armored vehicles of the Tutsi-dominated military fired indiscriminately into Hutu suburbs of Bujumbura this week, [redacted] Residents [redacted] are afraid to leave their homes.

— *The military crackdown on Hutus, inspired by the slaughter of Tutsis in Rwanda, may rekindle the ethnic bloodletting that reportedly has killed more than 100,000 Burundians since last year.* [redacted]

A ruling by the Tutsi-dominated Constitutional Court yesterday calls into question the recent installation of President Ntibantunganya *and may presage efforts by Tutsi politicians to reopen agreements on political power sharing and possibly to enlist the support of the military.*

— In southern Rwanda, aid workers report that thousands of Rwandan Tutsi refugees have been killed by Rwandan Hutu militias near the Burundi border. [redacted]
