**Hurdles to Peace Talks**

Fighting between the government and the Tutsi-dominated Rwandan Patriotic Front for the capital is intensifying. [REDACTED] report that the RPF controls important areas in Kigali, and the rebel radio claims RPF forces captured a northern city on Monday.

— *After two weeks of fighting, the RPF's early confidence of a decisive victory may be slipping away.* [REDACTED]

Tanzanian President Mwinyi is planning to host peace talks starting this weekend, and Ugandan President Museveni has told [REDACTED] he is pressing the rebels to accept a cease-fire and join the talks.

— The RPF has refused publicly to negotiate with the interim government, however, and has told Museveni that a cease-fire would allow renegade government units to continue slaughtering Tutsi civilians. [REDACTED]
