


According to a press report, a member of the ruling military council personally assured a group of 250 mostly American students last night that the Council had taken measures to secure their safety and property. [REDACTED]

Grenadian Military Activity

Announcements today over Radio Free Grenada indicate the Revolutionary Military Council may be mobilizing the remainder of the Army and the 2,000-4,000 member militia.

--Those with government-owned vehicles were ordered to turn them in today. Persons resisting this order would be "dealt with severely".

--The radio continued to warn against foreign military intervention, especially in the guise of protecting other country's nationals. [REDACTED]
