SUBJECT : Security Control Established by Calligeris to protect
Military plans and operations

1. Persons scheduled to take part in the proposed military operations have been brought into the operations on a need-to-know basis.

2. In each force or group forming part of the operations only the commander and assistant commander have knowledge of the unit's mission or task. At this stage the commanders have only the general details of mission, arms, men, etc. Just prior to D-Day commanders will be fully instructed.

3. For security as well as military reasons, each force is being so organized, equipped, and given mission assignments as to be able to act and sustain itself independently. The respective forces will function in this manner until such time as they can come under the direct control of Calligeris immediately following D-Day.

4. There are only four (4) persons in Central America who are cognizant of the complete plan for military operations. These are: a) Calligeris; b) E 2, c) Seekford; d) a former Guatemalan army major.

5. Only Calligeris has a complete set of the military plans in Central America. No personnel brought to Honduras for briefing are permitted to leave with any portion of the plan in writing.

6. Appropriate written orders, maps, etc., will be distributed just prior to D-Day.

7. Since early June 1952 all correspondence and communications have been carried out by courier. Specifically, Calligeris has not sent a letter through the public mails to Mexico since early June.

8. Since June Calligeris has been developing a counters intelligence net to work within his own organization.
