Subject: Contact with Pancho and Manuel, 19 may.

1. Pancho was requested to contact the editor of Pronto and instruct him to refrain in the future from publishing any story similar to the atom bomb thing unless previously cleared through us. Pancho agreed that the story was ridiculous and that tighter control of material published in Pronto should be established. He stated, however, that he believed that one of our friends was in contact with [redacted]. I stated that to my knowledge none of our group representatives was up there dealing with PP matters. Is this correct?
2. Pancho stated that the [redacted] seemed reluctant to come forth with [redacted] on communism, but that he would make another statement to convince him. In the meanwhile, I suggested that Pancho include a statement [redacted] in the next speech which he will record. Pancho's next proclamation, to be recorded this week, will deal with farmers, laborers, women, professional men, students, and the church. Note: Pancho feels that he should not make too many declarations of this sort since he believes that it might be too much of a good thing. Pancho also has reservations about his speech-making abilities. I tried to impress on him that now is the time to limber up and polish up his delivery, since he will be called on to make quite a few speeches in the future, and that he should take advantage of Manuel's coaching.
3. After considerable discussion, Pancho agreed that we should proceed with our original idea of having La Voz take over completely from Ceuage. He requested that I transmit those instructions to Manuel and that we set the paper up as we saw fit. Pancho stated that in case that Manuel runs into difficulty with the student group, which is very attached to Ceuage, he will issue a direct order that it be done exactly as we suggest without further delay. Note: I transmitted this instructions to Manuel and our next issue should bear the La Voz del Ejercito, Organo del Comitè Coordinador Anticomunista heading only.
4. When I suggested that Manuel take advantage of his trip to Mexico to set up the smuggling route from Tapachula to Mazatlan, Pancho stated that Manuel could aid in this, but that [redacted] could actually set it up and run the deal from Mexico. He agreed to instruct [redacted] in this respect as soon as possible.
5. Pancho stated that his idea on "Justicismo", not Justicialismo, as I previously stated, are very general, that he and Col. Flores have not come to any definite formula. However, in general, Pancho stated that the idea is simply that he proposes to establish the idea that in all his approaches to political & economic problems in his country, he will attempt to deal justly in all cases without granting any starata in society any spacial privileges. He stated that it was unfortunate that Peron had used a term so similar and that he has not yet settled on Justicismo as the exact word, although the general principle will definitely be applied.
6. Pancho agreed to the use of a refugee who served in a cell inside the army in one of our dramatizations, and suggested that the case of Mendez be used. This was discussed with Andres and Juan Jose, and we agreed to have Mendez make a formal, notarized declarations and to agree to its dramatization in writing.
7. Pancho agreed that it would be a good idea to issue the intercepted document deal about 1 June, but requested that the group make up some kind of a document he can show to Manuel as a basis for the frame up. He stated that he believed that we had the necessary material up there to doctor up a document of that sort.
8. On Morales Orell, Pancho stated that the stories circulated here to the effect that the boy committed suicide are completely false, and that the local embassy did its best to plant such stories. Note: See attached issue of Grafico, dtated 15 may. Pancho stated that the story appearing in this paper is completely false and was instigated by his enemies in the local embassy. According to Pancho, [redacted] was near Morales when the accident took place, but it was deemed unadvisable to have him make any declarations to the press. Pancho stated that Morales had no reason whatever for committing suicide and that his behaviour did not give any indication that he was considering such a step. Pancho stated that he believed that the boy may have believed that he was firing an empty chamber but that since he was not very familiar with the Colt automatic, he did not realize that the magazine revolves when when pulls the

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trigger. Morales had played Russian roulette before on several occasions, according to Pancho, Manuel and Colorado, and the odds finally caught up with him.

9. Pancho suggested that if his book is not to be used at present, it might be a good idea to use excerpts on the clandestine radio. If the group is interested, Pancho will forward the final manuscript up immediately.

10. Attached are receipts for all money given to Pancho for this month.

11. Attached also are copies of Pronto and El Combate supplied by Manuel. Unfortunately, neither publication was advised in time to drop the 333 deal. A cable has been sent to both to that effect. Attached also is copy of complete radio program schedule and Editorial and articles for the next issue of La Voz. Copies of correspondence between Pancho and [ ] are attached along with biographical data on [ ]

12. In connection with info given to Pancho from [ ]

a. [ ] is still here.

b. Pancho agrees that [ ] is a loose talker. He will instruct that they clamp down on him. Pancho stated that the boy is anxious to get into action and that he believes that he will be a valuable man when the time comes to put him to work.

c. [ ] is being investigated. Andres stated that he has informed to that respect.

d. Para d requires no comment.

N 13. As stated in my cable, Manuel stated that we will run out of feminine program material soon. If group can not supply same, we will attempt to manufacture same locally.

14. Pancho did not have the Psy-war info ready but promised same before he leaves on his trip.
