
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
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
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


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The Rwanda Factor

In our view, the protracted war between the Rwandan Hutu-dominated military and the mainly Tutsi rebels of the Rwandan Patriotic Front (RPF) is fueling fears among Burundi's hardline Tutsis of Hutu majority control of the government and the military. Moreover, the RPF's example—using its continued military successes to back political demands—may spur Burundi's military to demand concessions, including an end to Hutu proposals that the military be ethnically integrated. 
Meanwhile, the Burundian military is tacitly supporting the RPF's recruitment of combatants from the roughly 70,000 Rwandan Tutsi refugees already in camps in northern Burundi. It almost certainly sympathizes with the plight of fellow Tutsis in Rwanda who are at risk from Hutu militias. If the Burundian military makes public its support for the Rwandan rebels, it could spark Hutu reprisals at home and intensify ethnic conflict in the region. [redacted]

The prospect of a mass influx of Rwandan Hutu refugees also has explosive potential. [redacted] *Burundi's military has cooperated so far with international relief workers in assisting refugees and Burundian returnees from Rwanda, but a large influx of Hutu refugees into Burundi may panic the Tutsi-military because they would enter an area of Burundi hardest hit by Hutu-Tutsi tensions. In response to such a development, the military might block Hutu refugees from crossing the border or commit atrocities against them.* [redacted]

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
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
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
