MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: [redacted] Identification of FDSP Address in
Belgrade

1. [redacted] This memorandum details [redacted] identification of the Belgrade address for the Yugoslav Federal Directorate for Supply and Procurement (FDSP). I have coordinated this memorandum with team members [redacted]

2. [redacted] In early April, officers from the [redacted] requested [redacted] analysts to confirm an address for FDSP in Belgrade; I believe that this address was a post office box address. The team provided [redacted] locations of FDSP sites in Yugoslavia, [redacted] Bulevar Umetnosti 2 in Belgrade. This address apparently was the target which NATO forces intended to bomb last Friday night when they struck the Chinese Embassy.

3. [redacted] News reports this past weekend indicating that FDSP had been the intended target for last Friday's attack prompted us to review the information we provided to [redacted]. We remain confident that the Bulevar Umetnosti 2 address is correct based on the following sources:

- FDSP publications identify this as the firm's headquarters. Indeed, searches of FDSP's Internet site on both 7 April and 9 May 1999 showed this to be the firm's location.

- Various [redacted] between 1994 and December 1998 also confirm that this is the firm's location.
