1. The Cuban Intelligence Community. The following represent in general the various groups engaged in intelligence and/or investigative activity against counterrevolutionary action in Cuba and abroad:

a. The MINFAR Group - This group, which constitutes the largest single grouping of units within the Cuban Intelligence Community, is under the direct control of the Ministry of the Revolutionary Armed Forces (MINFAR), headed by Raul CASTRO. It is composed of the following units:

- (1) G-23, a small but select group of intelligence operators who work out of the MINFAR building (the ex-Ministry of the Navy) in Havana under the direct control of Raul CASTRO. ^{CARDED}
- (2) The G-2, headed by Ramiro VALDES Mendez, ^{CARDED} with Headquarters in Ciudad Libertad, Havana, with control over the following G-2 offices:
 - (a) The G-2 Compound in Ciudad Libertad, the site of the G-2 Headquarters.
 - (b) The G-2 office, formerly DIER, located on 5^a Avenida and Calle 14, Miramar District, Havana, headed by Abelardo COLOME Ibarra. ^{CARDED}
 - (c) The G-2 office located at the Rancho Boyeros Airport, Havana, headed by 1st Lt. Orlando MATOS Bozan. ^{CARDED}
 - (d) The G-2 office located at the Havana Port, head unknown.
 - (e) Operational offices distributed throughout Havana (See paragraph 10).
 - (f) The G-2 Provincial offices.

- (3) Chief of the Airplane Escort Service: Private ROSENDO who calls himself Lt. ROSENDO.
- (4) Clerks, Julio JIMENEZ^{CARDED} and his brother, civilians responsible for the preparation and reception of the offices' correspondence, reports on detainees, wanted lists, etc.
- (5) Teletype operator, Fnu GUERRA, a mulatto soldier.
- (6) Files clerk, name unknown, responsible for the maintenance of the office files which are located on the second floor of the Airport building.

c. The Travel Control Unit of the Rancho Boyeros Airport is composed of the following individuals:

- (1) José MESSIR, civilian.
- (2) Cesar SIMÓN, Army Sgt.
- (3) Fnu BANDERA⁹, Army Private.
- (4) Fnu CORREDERAS¹⁰.
- (5) Angela_____.
- (6) Melba_____.
- (7) María Julia_____.

d. The Special Surveillance Unit is composed of:

- (1) Fnu ANAYA
- (2) Ricardo MORALES
- (3) Pilla_____, assigned to Customs.
- (4) Amparito ANTELO, assigned to Customs.
- (5) Felipe CASANOVA^{CARDED}, Baggage Inspector.

This unit effects surveillance on travelers, particularly U. S. citizens.

e. Source indicated that the following units at the Airport cooperate closely with the G-2: Immigration, Customs, the National Bank office, the INIT, and the telephone switchboard. The following individuals cooperate closely with the G-2: Angel BAÑOS (aka CHEMOLEY), Chief of the Airport Militia and his group; Ricardo PIMENTEL^{CARDED} who works with Cubana Airlines; a great number of the Cubana Airline employees; and a 2nd Lt. nicknamed "Tiburón". Source indicates that the Police unit at the Airport also cooperates closely with the G-2. The Chief of this unit is Fnu OLAYO, an Army Sgt. The Police control the Money Exchange office and the candy counter.

7. G-2 Office, Havana Port - Source knows such an office exists but has no details on same.

8. G-2 Provincial Offices - The G-2 has the following offices in the Provinces:

- a. Pinar del Rio, headed by Captain Fnu YIBRE¹¹.
- b. Matanzas, headed by Captain Fnu FERNÁNDEZ.
