1. Your suggestions in paragraphs 1 and 4 of Reference A sound fine to us. We are attaching information which was acquired through EWING sources, State Department files and [Redacted]. You have previously received the information contained [Redacted] (Reference B).

2. Because Subject's source of funds and true mission are unclear, we are forwarding the information as received without attempting to distill or analyze it. We felt that any conclusions we might draw would be misleading. We do know that Subject is "slick" & probably to the point of misrepresenting himself, and we do not discount [Redacted].

2. Silberman has been described as short, dark complexion, black hair, fast talker, and is regarded as a "smooth operator." He was also described by another source as glib, slick, quick-tongued, fast talker, and creates impressions which are not true. It was also stated that he writes exceedingly well, and has had considerable experience in Africa.

3. Silberman was originally described as being attached to the Planning Department at the University of Chicago in Anthropology. Further information indicated that he was a senior research associate and professional lecturer in planning at the University of Chicago from February 1955 through January 1956. From February 1956 through June 1956, he was simply a lecturer in planning, not a staff position. *(professional)*

4. Silberman's current mailing address is reported to be c/o Balliol College, Oxford University.

5. Silberman's alleged connection with Oxford University was checked through various publications with negative results. He is not listed at all in a 1957 catalog regarding Balliol College. He is not listed in another 1957 Oxford index relating to their Political Science Department. Nor is he listed in the "Commonwealth University Yearbook for 1957" which is a general index of all people associated with U K and Commonwealth educational institutions.

7. [redacted] Silberman notified [redacted] that he had been awarded a grant by the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace. He said that this grant was in the amount of eleven thousand dollars and was for the purpose of making a study of the Somali-Ethiopia Border Dispute.
