Dear Mr. Korte:

This letter is in response to two of your appeals to this Agency. By letter of 30 October 1985, you appealed our decision to deny you access to eleven OSS documents and by letter of 5 November 1985, you appealed the decision to deny you access to CIA information contained in eleven Army documents. These twenty-two documents were referred to this Agency by the U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command in response to your 22 February 1984 request to the Army for information concerning Friedrich Schwend.

As stated in our letter of 5 December 1985, we are combining our determinations on the eleven Army-originated documents and the eleven OSS documents into one appeal response to you.

Your appeal has been presented to the Central Intelligence Agency Information Review Committee. Pursuant to the authority delegated under paragraph 1900.51(a) of Chapter XIX, Title 32 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Mr. Clair E. George, Deputy Director for Operations has reviewed the documents, the determinations made with respect to them and the propriety of the application of the exemptions to the FOIA under which your appeal was considered. Mr. George's determinations follow:

Exemption (b)(1) encompasses matters which are specifically authorized under criteria established by the appropriate Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and which are, in fact, currently and properly classified.

Exemption (b)(3) pertains to information exempt from disclosure by statute. The relevant statutes are subsection 102(d)(3) of the National Security Act of 1947, as amended, 50 U.S.C. §403(d)(3), which makes the Director of Central Intelligence responsible for protecting intelligence sources and methods from unauthorized disclosure and section 6 of the Central Intelligence Agency Act of 1949, as amended, 50 U.S.C. §403g, which exempts from the disclosure requirement information pertaining to the organization, functions, names, official titles, salaries, or numbers of personnel employed by the Agency.

Enclosed are copies of the releasable documents.

In accordance with the provisions of the FOIA, you have the right to seek judicial review of the above determinations in a United States district court.

We appreciate your patience while your appeal was being considered.
