It is noted that your investigative report of 31 January 1952, New York City, pages eight to twelve, contains several references to a Kurt Lewin, professor at Iowa State University in 1940,

The above Kurt Lewin is, identical to Kurt Lewin, borp 9 September 1890, Mogilno (then Germany/and later Poland)

Kurt Lewin was an applicant for use as a Consultant by OSS in connection with the operation of the Morale Operations-Far East School. Available information indicates that Lewin may have been used by OSS for a period of time during World War II.

As an attachment to this memorandum your Bureau is being furnished biographical and other pertinent information contained in the 25 March 1944 Personal History Statement which Kurt Lewin completed in connection with his application for OSS employment.


