



He expressed serious dissatisfaction with the methods and procedures of the Commission, and said that there are constant disagreements among the commission members over technicalities. commented that the majority of the commission ignore the fact that they are not accomplishing their mission.

that the National Assembly does not have the right to try former President GUIZADO. He said, however, that they will do so for "political reasons", and that the courts had upheld the right of the National Assembly to try GUIZADO because of a desire not to be further involved in the matter. went on to say that he does not believe that the evidence accumulated to date by the commission is sufficient to convict GUIZADO, even though he acknowledged that the public firmly believes that GUIZADO is one of the instigators of REMON's assassination.

Ruben MIRO has not changed his original confession in the slightest detail and maintains a firm and cynical attitude; neither has MIRO implicated any others in the crime. said that he, as well as all of the members of the commission, is of the opinion that there are many more people involved in the assassination, but that clarification of this matter will probably take a long time because of the investigative procedures being used.

4.

concluded by saying that he will continue in his present position with the Commission on a day-to-day basis, but that he is thinking of telling Alejandro REMON, Minister of Government and Justice, of his desire to disassociate himself from the official investigation.
