





Irving Martin Lipstein, a United States citizen suspected of complicity in the assassination of President REMON of Panama, arrived at La Guaira, Venezuela, from Mexico at 6 a.m. on 2 January 1955, aboard the Steamship ANDREA GRITTI. Although Lipstein held a ticket for Genoa, Italy, he said that he was dissatisfied with the service aboard ship and wished to return to Mexico.
