2. Mr. _____ served with the Office of Strategic Services from 1941 to 1945. He was investigated by the FBI for the Office of the Coordinator of Information during the May-July 1942 period. This investigation was entirely favorable. Mr. _____ left the Office of Strategic Services on 2 November 1945.

3. Mr. _____ was again investigated by the FBI in 1951 based on a request for an Atomic Energy Commission "Q" clearance. This investigation was also completely favorable.
