SUBJECT: Field Investigation Results on Tschirim SOOBZOKOV.

"SUBJECT was referred to by various people during the investigation as being an opportunist, cheap politician, arrogant, "shrewd," faker, psycho."

"SUBJECT Stated to informant that he had been a Lieutenant in the Russian Army and, at the same time, was a member of the Russian Underground Forces. He claims to have been wounded while on a mission with the underground and, as a result of his underground activities, Subject's family was executed by the Russians and Subject fled the country."

"SUBJECT claims that he is a White Russian who was born in the Caucasus, and "Hates the communist."

"SUBJECT ~~is~~ suspected on being Soviet agent while residing in Jordan with Circassian colony, possibly is a double agent, but no facts can be brought forth to support these rumors."

"SUBJECT stated to this confidential informant that after his arrival in the U.S., he made several trips to Wash., D.C., to speak to the authorities, not otherwise identified, in an effort to assist in keeping Circassians residing in the Near East from returning to the USSR and becoming Communist. However, SUBJECT stated that the people he met in Washington, D.C. were quite ignorant, inefficient and had no understanding of the problem. Subject stated that he returned home without accomplishing anything and was very much disgusted over the whole affair. Subject was not involved in any pro-Soviet activities while residing in the U.S." *what is significant last sentence? where opinion?*

"November 1955, Subject was supposedly injured in a car accident on 25 November 1955. Subject claimed that he was not injured. Mr. BISHOP, manager of TOTOWA Motors, the driver of the vehicle in which SUBJECT was riding demanded a Paterson policeman to drive Subject to the hospital for a check-up. A physical check-up showed that Subject was not injured. Subject began going from Doctor to doctor without any relief from his pain. Subject finally went to a doctor in New York, this doctor charged Subject \$30100 per visit. As a result Subject sued the manager of TOTOWA Motors, the driver of the other vehicle. 8 November 1956, the outcome of the case was still unknown."

"SUBJECT told a Sergeant Hugh BOHNY, that he had been a lieutenant in the Soviet Army and during some period of time was secretly in the Russian Underground." Sergeant BOHNY, drove the Subject to the Hospital for a check-up."

"20 December 1955, Subject seemed to have planned to visit England, Lebanon, and Jordan. The trip was to be for a two-weeks. The purpose of the trip was to visit a sick brother, whose address was P.O.B. 326, ALMAN, Jordan. 8 May 1956, Subject was granted and re-entry permit to the U.S.A. Subject planned to use TWA transportation." (a penciled note on the thermofax copy; "Who paid for this trip?")
