SUBJECT: Excerpts from recent reports of the U.S. Navy, Stockholm.

" STATISTISCHES JAHRBUCH FUER DAS DEUTSCHE REICH (your 311 November 5).
1938 edition is latest. Have instead ordered STATISTIK DES DEUTSCHEN
REICHS (Unabridged annual statistics) 1939 onward.

HANDBUCH DER DEUTSCHEN AKTIENGESELLSCHAFTEN (also requested for IDC in
Department's airgram No. A-21 of February 4, received February 25). Ex-
port is prohibited by German Government, as stated in my telegram 80
February 7, 1943 in reply to your 197 December 17, 1942. Repeated attempts
during 1943 to procure various volumes of annual series failed. No copies
(post 1940) available in Sweden.

Haucke: BULGARIEN dispatched in packet 88 (March 7)

COMPASS 1943. See my telegrams 513 September 12, 619 October 5, and 806
December 11. No more copies have arrived in Sweden. For past six months
local reference library endeavored to obtain missing (1) BOHMEN UND MAHREN
SLOWAKEI nad (2) OSTMARK-SUDETENLAND. It is noteworthy that German Leg-
ation warned Librarian to restrict access to COMPASS as "this publication
from 1940 onward contains information of value to enemy and therefore of
interest to spies".

DEUTSCHES REICHS - ADRESSBUCH FUER INDUSTRIE, GEMERBE HANDEL (two copies
also requested for IDC in Department's airgram No. A-12 January 24, recei-
ved February 7). Export is prohibited by German Government (publishers
regularly replied "out of print" to my repeated orders throughout 1943).
Propitious moment for borrowing local reference copies (Vols. I-VI, 1941-
1943) came in January, and I immediately informed you of film roll numbers
(2041-2043, 2046-2048, 2057, 2058) in my telegram 2 February 2. Photo-off-
set of these invaluable films is advisable. Please not that entire series
of six volumes (pre-war five) is no longer published annually. Only Vols.
I (film rolls 2041-2042) VI (Not yet in Stockholm) appeared in 1943. So
far no issues announced for 1944.

Re time element. In general you must now allow from six to 12 months for
books (less time for periodicals and newspapers) ordered from Germany or
German-occupied territory. There are retarding factors to be borne in
mind, e.g. (1) lack of transit facilities and (2) air-raid destruction
(all publishing houses of Leipzig and majority of Berlin bombed-out; of
last sentence of my air gram A-26 December 28 sent to Department as my
A-1041). Therefore I venture respectfully to emphasize futility of such
requests as "cable probable date when you expect to receive this or that
publication".
