Subject: Orders.

To : Commanding Officer, Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment,
Office of Strategic Services, Washington 25, D. C.
Commanding Officer, First Airport of Embarkation, ATC, Miami, Florida
(Attention: Priorities and Traffic Officer, 36th St. Airport)

1. It is desired that you take, without delay, the action for which you are responsible, to prepare for foreign service, and to send Technical Sergeant Robert E. Lang, 33455619, from Washington, D. C., and/or New York New York, and/or Miami, Florida to an oversea destination by air transportation under APR-20123150-USG, which number will be incorporated in orders issued.

2. This is a PERMANENT change of station. Direct communication in connection with this movement is authorized.

3. Travel by military, naval or commercial aircraft (Par. 3, AR 55-120, 1943) is directed, for the accomplishment of an emergency war mission. Travel by Army or Naval transport, commercial steamship, belligerent vessel or aircraft and rail is authorized. In lieu of subsistence, a flat per diem of \$7.00 is authorized for travel by military, naval or commercial aircraft, in accordance with existing law and regulation. A total baggage allowance of eighty (80) pounds is authorized while traveling by air, twenty-five (25) pounds of which is special OSS equipment. Travel by air and/or rail to Miami, Florida, is authorized.

4. Clothing and individual equipment (summer and winter) will be taken as prescribed in T/E #21, 10 March 1943, and changes thereto, with the following items:

First Aid Packet

Emergency "K" ration

a. Masks, gas, service, except diaphragm type will not be taken from present station to the airport of embarkation, and mask, gas, service, M3-10-6 or M3-10A1-6, light weight, will be issued individual not equipped with mask, gas, diaphragm at the airport of embarkation.

5. a. The enlisted man involved in this movement will be advised IN THE CLEAR AND AS EARLY AS PRACTICABLE BEFORE MOVEMENT TO THE STAGING AREA OR AIRPORT OF EMBARKATION of the Post Office address. He will be instructed to furnish it to his friends and relatives by use of WD AGO Form 204, Change of Address Cards.
