

TO : Commanding Officer, Signal Section, 2677 Regiment,

1. During the campaign in Southern France, and the subsequent pursuit of the 19th German Army to the Vosges, the Seventh U.S. Army enjoyed the benefits of a continuous flow of intelligence from various types of OSS agents, many of whom were deep in enemy territory and who were dependent upon radio communication as their only means of receiving instructions and transmitting acquired information. The maintenance of this widespread net of radio communications in enemy territory was made possible by the faithful and highly proficient work of the Signal Section, 2677 Regiment, OSS at the Regimental Base in North Africa. Though decidedly less glamorous, and much less likely to receive appropriate recognition, the work of the Base Signal Section was an indispensable link in the chain of a highly successful OSS operation, which made an outstanding contribution to the success of the Seventh Army campaign in Southern France.

2. It is desired not only to acknowledge the valuable contribution made by the Signal Section, 2677 Regiment, OSS, to Seventh Army operations, but also to express appreciation and commendation for the fidelity and efficiency with which the mission of the section was accomplished.
