


The Director has asked me to respond to your letter of December 20, 1991 which requested information on former senior Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) personnel in Laos and Vietnam and on US citizens who had not returned from Laos from 1961 to the present as a result of assignments in or over Laos prior to 1975.

The Agency possesses two lists relating to US citizens who have not returned from Laos during the period 1961 to the present. The first is the DIA list of "US Unaccounted for in Southeast Asia." The second is a list compiled at CIA Headquarters on September 30, 1969 entitled, "American Air Contractor Operating Crew Fatalities (in) Laos, 1961 to Present." A copy of the second list is enclosed. That list showed two American civilians as missing in Laos: Air America employee, Eugene H. DeBruin, who is still listed as missing; and Bird & Son employee, Ernest Brace, who returned on March 28, 1973.

We have reviewed our files but have not located any lists received by the United States Government from foreign governments, contacts or individuals which relate to US individuals who have not returned from Laos. We will be reviewing a considerable volume of archived files in the coming week and will advise the Committee if any material on this subject is located.

Specifically, we request the following items:

1. Please provide to the committee full names and current last known residential and business addresses for Central Intelligence Agency Chiefs of Station, Deputy Chiefs of Station, and any other personnel with responsibilities for POW/MIA matters assigned to the U.S. Embassy in Vientiane, Laos, and the U.S. Embassy in Bangkok, Thailand, for each year between the period of 1961 to present.
2. Please provide to the committee any lists compiled or received by the Central Intelligence Agency which relate to U.S. citizens who have not returned from Laos during the period of 1961 to present as a result of assignments in or over Laos prior to 1975.
3. Please provide to the committee any lists in the possession of the Central Intelligence Agency which have been received by the United States Government from foreign governments or contacts, or individuals which relate to U.S. personnel who have not returned from Laos.
4. Please provide the names of U.S. citizens who were assigned to Air America, Continental Air Services, or any other CIA proprietary organization and have not returned from Laos.
5. Please provide the full names and last known residential and business addresses for personnel assigned to


the security office of Air America in Vientiane Airport during the period of Air America's existence.
