WAR CRIMES TRIBUNAL

1. Information from [redacted] on the above-named organizations has recently come to the attention of this Agency. Both groups may be described as rightist and closely allied to Nazism. The MNP was founded on 30 January 1965, by a fusion of the FEN and the "Comite Soutien d'Europe Action" (Action Committee for the Support of Europe). The latter organization, not fully described, also appears to be of a rightist nature.

2. On 30 April and 1 May 1966 the First Congress of the MNP was held in Paris, France. United States' representatives who attended this Congress were described as:

- a. Hilaire du BERRIER: Journalist, writer, and member of the Free World Committee, and
- b. Leslie WEOLER: Journalist, belonging to the right (Goldwater) wing of the Republican Party.

- b. The Odiasse Religion "IUC" (Inc.), (James Konrad Warner), Box 1896, Hollywood, California.
- c. Dan Burros, 152 West 42nd Street, Suite 536, New York.
- d. American States Right Party, Box 8299, Eusley Station, Birmingham, Alabama.
- e. Richard Morphew. "The Citizen", The Official Journal of the Citizen's Council of America, 315-325 Plaza Building, Jackson, Mississippi.
- f. Major Cottle, 112 Pruice James Drive, Hampton, Virginia (Harbored an envoy of Europe-Action who had come to the U. S. to establish contacts with The John Birch Society and the National Socialist Right Party).
- g. Aldo Rosario Tuero. 1126 NW 6th Street, Apt. E, Miami. (Chief of Movimiento Nacionalista Cristiano (Christian Nationalist Movement), Cuban section of Joven America /Young America/). Tuero is a Cuban refugee. Very active and very well known in all the neo-Nazi movements of North and South America.
- h. Brig. Gen. W. P. Campbell. Vice President of The National Education Program, 900 East Center Avenue, Searcy, Arkansas.

(This is not a neo-Nazi movement but only anti-communist. However, it has been unwittingly exploited by the neo-Nazi movements, in particular by "Joven America" (Reisch) and by Europe Action and the FEN since July 1965. Brig. Gen. Campbell is in contact with Gen. Walker. He also introduced some of the leaders of "Joven America" to J. Edgar Hoover (F. B. I.).

j. J. H. Johnson. "Truth Seeker", Box 2832, San Diego, California. Also exploited in Dany Peese's letters (sic).

l. Christian Educational Association, 530 Chestnut Street, Union, New Jersey (Publishes the review Common Sense).

m. National Blue Shirts. New Orleans.

n. Christian National Crusade, P.O. Box 27895, Los Angeles, California 90027.

With the exceptions listed below, there were no additional pertinent identifiable items of information in the files of this agency on this group of individuals and organizations.

a. Christian Educational Association: This organization was located at 530 Chestnut Street, Union, New Jersey. It was also known as the Loyal American Group or Loyal American Congress.

Reference is made to your memorandum on the same subject of 30 November 1954.

b. George Lincoln ROCKWELL: Reference is made to Bureau memoranda concerning Subject dated 10 and 17 July 1959.

c. National Blue Shirts: Unsourced OSS information dated 18 July 1945 and 15 August 1947 concerns the Blue Shirt Organization, possibly identifiable with the National Blue Shirts. It states that this was an anti-Japanese organization in China, and that the BIS, a Chinese Secret Service organization, was an outgrowth of the Blue Shirts. The aim of the Blue Shirts was the preservation and extension of the authority of the Generalissimo (CHIANG Kai-shek).




