1. [redacted] Comment: This is apparently a working paper rather than an official release of the Tribunal.
2. [redacted] Comment: The informant reported that Basso's speech was highly praised by Tribunal Secretariat officers, particularly by Russell Stetler, Jr., who said that Basso's summary was "brilliant" and he thought the Vietnamese should have done more homework before coming to the Tribunal and thus would have been able to present something similar. According to press reports of 10 May, Basso attempted to show in his speech that "in Vietnam new forms of aggression have been used".
3. [redacted] Comment: Mr. Vutthi is probably Thouth Vuthi or Vutthi, a member of the Cambodian Foreign Office.
