10. [redacted] Received a call from [redacted] Administrative Assistant to Representative William Moorhead (D., Pa.), who asked if we would check Agency records in the possible hope that [redacted] is employed by the Agency. There is an illness in the family and they are trying to locate him. After checking with [redacted] EA Division, the Office of Personnel, and the Office of Security, I told [redacted] that we have no record of the individual.

11. [redacted] Al Tarabochia, Senate Internal Security Subcommittee staff, called to say he had received a call from [redacted] [redacted] inquiring as to whether Tarabochia had any further word about the translation of his book into Spanish for publication in [redacted] Tarabochia told [redacted] that he would have to check through his own channels on this question and he also told [redacted] he could see some definite problems on such a move at this time. Tarabochia asked me to drop by his office which I did later in the day.

[redacted] At that time he gave me a number of Subcommittee publications which [redacted] had requested and he also gave me another picture of [redacted] We will pass all of these to [redacted] through DCD channels.

12. [redacted] - GLC) In response to his request yesterday I left with David Martin, Senate Internal Security Subcommittee staff, a number of unclassified publications on the World Peace Council, especially the meeting held in Budapest in 1971. I also gave Martin the thrust of unclassified information contained in one of our publications on this subject.

13. [redacted] - GLC) Met with Jim Woolsey, Senate Armed Services Committee staff, and left with him a copy of Howard Osborn's memorandum of 3 August 1973 to the Acting General Counsel and a "Submission for the Record" clarifying a statement made by Mr. Schlesinger at line 16, page 61 of his testimony before the Committee on 11 May 1973. I asked Woolsey how he would like us to handle the provision of copies for Senator Ervin's Water-gate Committee and he asked that we give these to the Ervin Committee staff directly.
