Enclosed are BEC Forms 202, in duplicate, ("Employer's First Report of Accident or Occupational Illness") for Yik-Chiu To, Prasit Promsuwan, Pisidhi Indradat and Prasidhi Thanee. Our records indicate that a BEC Form 202 covering Mr. DeBruin was filed with the Bureau of Employees' Compensation in June 1964.

We apologize for not sending the enclosed forms to you earlier, but we had thought that BEC Forms 202 were not required in cases of detention and capture unless the employer elects to seek reimbursement from the U.S. Government under the War Hazards Compensation Act for amounts paid to the captured employee and his beneficiaries. Our company has not yet decided whether it will seek reimbursement from the United States Government under the War Hazards Compensation Act.
