



[redacted] four other SS-X-20 support bases under construction—two at the Drovyanaya ICBM complex in the eastern USSR and two at Mozyr Division MRBM complexes in the western USSR.

From support bases in the eastern and western USSR, the two-stage, solid-propellant SS-X-20 could cover targets in virtually all of Europe and Asia. It carries
