<p>1. We have located a photograph of Alexander DOLEZALEK [] born 24 February 1914, in his BDC file, which should already be available to Berlin. We defer to [] to determine, if they can do so with a 23-year old photograph, if DOLEZALEK is identical to the ① DOX(H) RING in the Berlin liaison office. Although DOLEZALEK will only be 56 in February 1970, it might be possible for him to retire earlier than 60 if he had maintained affiliation with the West German military service.</p> <p>2. Please note that the BDC file states that Alexander DOLEZALEK [] born 24 February 1914 in Berlin, was married to Dr. Luise DOLEZALEK nee FICK and that by January 1943 they had 2 children, ages 3 and almost 2. The UJVENTURE sheet for Alexander DOLEZALEK, ① Horst Guenther DOHRING [] states that his wife was named Luise; that they had 2 children, Friedrich and Gero; and that he lived in Berlin as early as 1952. For this reason we believe the Subjects of these 201 files to be identical, and we are closing [] into []</p> <p>3. FBIS Summary of 2 August 1954 (*KAPAHNKE 201)
ADN Press release of 31 July 1954, based on
statements made by KAPAHNKE.

In February 1954, when the conference of Foreign Ministers was taking place in Berlin, the member of the GEHLEN organization DOLEZALEK © DOERHING (the name is possibly inaccurate. KAPAHNKE knows it only from hearsay) carried out under instructions measures designed to compromise such politicians as used in any way dissatisfaction with ADENAUER's policies. These were members of the Lower House PFLEIDERER, FRIEDENSBURG, ER, OLLENHAUER, and others.

To that end, DOLEZALEK prepared a compromise proposal for the reunification of Germany which purported to come from the aforesaid men. He then requested Prof. (SCHMIDT) who lives in the French Sector of Berlin to hand this document to the Soviet delegation. DOLEZALEK expected that it would be possible to intercept possible replies sent to the aforementioned politicians who could then be accused of cooperating with the Soviets.
