In the course of his blackmarketing activities, etc. "I had no idea there was a German Intelligence Service?....." (For speculations on his sensitivity in this regard, please see paragraph 5, below.)

5. Operator's Estimate of the Subject: A highly intelligent, appealing personality with considerable of the bon-vivant in his makeup. Considers himself a connoisseur of women. Has a first class imagination. He is a romantic but inwardly quite stable. Quick and adaptable; appears to have a very great deal of presence of mind. It is believed his basic loyalties are a good deal stronger than he pretends and that he is actually quite loyal to Germany. His great weakness (as it is also probably his great asset) is his ready tongue. He has a great fund of miscellaneous information and many skills of considerable value and seldom found combined.
6. Remarks & Recommendations: Subject is very knowledgeable on the smuggling that goes on in Berlin and vicinity. If there is a call for such local information, he could probably supply a considerable amount. His talkativeness and tendency to free-wheel appear to be very difficult for him to control, and it is recommended that he be constantly jacked up on these points.
