Background:
 With the liberation of Czechoslovakia in 1945, the independent state of Slovakia fell and Monsignor Tiso was executed by the Czechoslovakian Government as a criminal. Dr. Ferdinand DURCANSKY, former Minister of Foreign Affairs from 1939 to 1941 in the Tiso Government, was also later adjudged a war criminal. He eluded apprehension and fled to South America where he ultimately resided in Buenos Aires, Argentina. DURCANSKY organized the "Slovak Action Committee" which advocated the return to the independent autonomous state of Slovakia. Recently DURCANSKY's organization has been referred to as the "Slovak Liberation Committee".

DURCANSKY has previously applied for admission to the United States but so far his request has not been granted. Information dated June 7, 1950, made available by another government agency indicates that he had been captured in Argentina because of the desire of the Argentine Government to maintain neutrality. He was vague as to his own organization although he stated that he would probably establish headquarters in either "Western Europe or North America."

..... He (Dr Krajcovic) stated that while living in Paris in the summer of 1946, he met Dr. Ferdinand DURCANSKY during the Paris Peace Conference. DURCANSKY learned that Krajcovic was going to the United States and prevailed upon him to consider acting as his representative in the United States. Krajcovic admired the anti-Communist propaganda of the "Slovak Action Committee" and promised to aid DURCANSKY's cause. However, upon coming to the United States and after discussing the "Slovak Action Committee" with Slovak leaders in the United States, Krajcovic concluded that he did not admire or desire to have anything to do with any organization with which DURCANSKY was affiliated.
