15 Jun 59:4. @Dr. ALBERTI: In connection with the NTS discussion, [DORBACH] said that he was delighted that approval had been granted for @Dr. ALBERTI to get into the act as far as NTS and the [KRASOWSKI] case were concerned. [DORBACH] said that he had had to do a fair amount of pushing to get this approved because [KLAUSNER] was much against it. On the other hand, @Dr. ALBERTI was very enthusiastic about the idea and also very enthusiastic about the [KRASOWSKI] case. [DORBACH] said that in his opinion @Dr. ALBERTI would be very helpful, would be able to take a considerable load off of [DORBACH] (ALBERTI would be dealing directly with the NTS case officer on the [KRASOWSKI] case) and that ALBERTI was considerably more competent than he often was given credit for being. [DORBACH] said that unfortunately ALBERTI had been pushed so far into the background with dull research work that his actual operational talents rarely had a chance to assert themselves. [DORBACH] concluded by saying that [KLAUSNER] had no respect for the NTS, did not see that there was any CE significance to the NTS, and thought it was a waste of time for any of his personnel to have anything to do with NTS or the emigres in general. This comment resulted in a general conversation about the CE versus positive significance of emigre activities in West Germany. Although [DORBACH] seemed to overrate the positive significance of the emigre field, he was very frank in admitting that emigre activities inevitably turn out to be a hotbed of CE activities or potential activities.

6 Sep 59, [ ] ... [DORBACH] also mentioned that he was finding the services of @ALBERTI a godsend. [DORBACH] said that although @ALBERTI had been reluctantly freed by [KLAUSNER] to work only on the [ABRIDGON/154] case @ALBERTI was taking a healthy interest in the overall [ ] [CE] problem and was branching out to such an extent that it was saving [DORBACH] a considerable amount of time and effort. [DORBACH] said that he hoped to be able to get @ALBERTI, whom he described as extremely competent in the Soviet emigre field, increasingly into NTS matters presuming [KLAUSNER] did not clamp down on the use of @ALBERTI. [DORBACH] said that @ALBERTI was personally very pleased with the new arrangement and felt for the first time in years that his extensive background was being put to proper use. ...

7 May 59, ABC check sheet from [ ] and [ ] Referent on Soviet emigre matters (CE). "Authority" on structure and organization of RIS. Although he is in "Evaluations", ALBERTI has one agent (V-2626) who is his contact to emigre circles. ALBERTI formerly compiled the CE Sitrep.

4 Apr 60, [ ]: [DORBACH] talked at some length about his meeting in Frankfurt with [ ] and discussions with various [ ] members. [DORBACH] said that during his 6 week absence on sick leave @ALBERTI would take over the [UPSWING] responsibility for contact with [ ]

12 Jan 61, [ ]: [REIMER] said that @ALBERTI carried a pistol so large that it had been dubbed a "Zimmer Flak".
