Visit of German Chancellor
Ludwig Ehrhardt to United
States, June 11-13, 1964

Chancellor Ehrhardt departed New York for Washington,
D.C., June 12, 1964 at 8:45 A.M.

Detective Widinger, Bureau of Special Services,
New York City Police Department, advised on June 12, 1964
that no untoward incidents occurred during Chancellor
Ehrhardt's stay in New York, although a small group of
twelve individuals, identified as members of Betar, a
Zionist youth organization, staged brief picket demon-
strations at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel and Kennedy Airport
on June 11 and June 12, 1964 protesting the participation
of German scientists in the missile program of the United
Arab Republic.

Detective Widinger advised these demonstrations
were conducted in a peaceful and orderly fashion and at
such distance that they did not come to the attention of
Chancellor Ehrhardt. No arrests were made.
