1. The files of OSU-CIA reflect the following information concerning the subject of your inquiry.

2. Mikhailo FEDAK, a resident of a Regensburg DP camp during the winter and spring of 1949, is known to have traveled in Poland from July to September 1949, on a clandestine courier mission for the OUN/Bandera (Organization of Ukrainian Nationalists). According to a confessed Polish agent, while in Poland his moves were reported systematically to the Polish intelligence service by a number of Ukrainian girls working for the Polish service, and it is suspected that he himself was recruited by that service. In the autumn of 1949, he brought two confessed recruits of the Polish intelligence service out of Poland, one of whom subsequently became his wife. He was convicted of illegal border crossing and possession of firearms in Germany in December 1949. Under interrogation in Germany he withheld information from representatives of this agency allegedly because of his oath to secrecy administered by the OUN/Bandera. Subject was described as extremely short, with dark blond curly hair and a poor complexion.
