SUBJECT : Extension of Visa for Jaroslava FADIK

1. Jaroslava FADIK, a long-time associate of the ADOLPH KRAMER Project from Germany, recently arrived in the United States for a visit. However, since he holds a stateless passport containing a German visa valid to 6 August 1955, IAS in New York limited his stay in the United States to two months rather than the usual three months as desired by Subject. This action, it is understood, was based on the law which requires that the visa of the home country of a stateless person must extend at least six months beyond the expiration date of a visa granted by another country. Through error then, the issuing authorities in Germany did not allow sufficient time in the return visa to Germany to permit Subject the maximum visit time in the United States.

2. It is requested that the Alien Affairs Staff arrange through IAS to extend Subject's current two month visa to three months thus fixing his return date to be June 15, 1955 rather than May 15, 1955 as it is at the present time. It is further suggested that Alien Affairs Staff, in making this request of IAS, give its assurance that Subject will leave the country on the specified date. (ADOLPH KRAMER Case Officer will see to this.)
