6. **SUBSTANCE:**

1. F. was given PRQ translated in Ukrainian and explained it. [] stressed the necessity to obtain as ~~many~~ as possible data on each individual.

F. hopes that during Christmass period he will have the opportunity to meet many people and ~~try to~~ spot someone for our purpose. F. was told to concentrate on subjects for cultural exchange (students, tourists) and relatives-visitors.

2. From talking to various people F. got impression that there is a decrease in correspondance between the people in Ukraine and their relatives and friends abroad. Some people in emigration who usually had received one letter a fortnight recently had one letter in four or 6 weeks. Also the contents of letters from Ukraine would indicate that ~~many~~ the people in Ukraine are more cautious in their writing. This ~~may~~ be a reflection on general worsening of the situation inside the S.U. F. was worried that any further worsening of the internal situation would discourage some emigrants who were going to visit their relatives in Ukraine.

3. F. considers Austria to be much more potentially productive than Germany. The reason for that is that most of Ukrainians in Austria are in possession of Austrian ~~not~~ citizenship and the contacts with Ukraine are more frequent.

F. was told to concentrate however above all on Germany without neglecting completely Austria if something concrete should crop there up.

4. [] discussed also with F. Matviyeyko's message, its impact on our and other political emigree groups, and general situation in Germany and in Ukraine.
