SPECIFIC - Heinz FELFE and Carl SCHUETZ

Ref- EGLA-318

1. Two different interrogation reports on Heinz FELFE, prepared by the British in July 1945, are available here. The following information was taken from these documents:

Heinz FELFE - born 18 March 1913 in Dresden; last resided in Dresden; HJ Scharfuhrer 1932-34; Allgemeine SS Sturmman 1936-39; served with the 3/120 Bau Battalion in the Polish campaign, then hospitalized and released due to being a student and having heart troubles; studied at Langem 1940-41 with a view towards becoming a civil official; student jurist at the University of Berlin in 1941-42, and Stipendiat der Polizei in order to continue his studies; 1942-43 Kriminalkommissar Anwaerter attending Fuhrerschule in Berlin; Hilfs Krim. Komm. at Kripoleitstelle Dresden in March 1943; at Kriminal Abt. Gleiwitz from April to August 1943; member Amt VI B 3 (Switzerland and Liechtenstein) in Berlin 1943-44; from December 1944 to May 1945 was member Amt VI BdS Holland.

During his interrogation, FELFE displayed intelligence and created a favorable impression. He was extremely straightforward, admitted having been an ardent Nazi, and did not try to put the blame on anyone else for anything. FELFE supplied information on Amt VI personnel and activities in Holland, and a very sketchy report on Amt VI B 3.

2. The only other pertinent traces here on Heinz FELFE are as follows:

JRL-1012, dated 1945:

Heinz FELFE - married; two children; unhealthy, pale face; dark brown hair; 1.70m tall; deputy Referats Leiter RSHA Amt VI/B/3 from April 1943 to October 1944; formerly with the Kripo in Kattowitz.

REF-4161, dated 17 June 1947:

Max WESSEL, Dutch national and suspected Communist, was at one time in contact with PROBSTING, Head of SD III B, Utrecht, and with FELFE (probably Heinz FELFE, an official of SD IV B Holland from December 1944 to May 1945). WESSEL allegedly attempted to have himself recruited by the RIS.

3. There is a reference in the German Primer to Carl SCHUETZ. Following are other possible traces on Carl SCHUETZ mentioned in reference.

Archives dossier, dated May 1943:

In May 1943, Kriegstechniker Karl SCHUETZ, a member of the German Army stationed in Bucharest, made application to marry Martha TRUATSCHE (?), a Volksdeutsch from Kronstadt. Since his future wife owned property in Rumania and wished to retain her Rumanian citizenship after her marriage, the legal advisor at the German Consulate in Kronstadt was asked for an interpretation of the applicable laws. The Consulate advised that the only other case of this type occurred when the daughter of General Zwiadinak (see MCGW-13947) married a German Army Captain in Bucharest.

Carded Information, dated 1943:

Karl SCHUTZ of Lausanne served as a cover address for the Axis IS.

SHAEF Card (see also German Prisoner)

Karl ~~von~~ SCHUTZ - SS Hstuf.; born about 1900; 1.70m tall; robust build; dark eyes; graying hair; big red nose; weather-beaten face; drinks a lot; repugnant; nervous mannerisms; violent and brutal; former Kripo official; head of Sipo and SD, Abt. IV, Rome in September 1943; head of the SD interrogation center in Rome in 1944; was later at Forli and Bologna.

EGGA-9432, dated 5 July 1949:

Karl SCHUTZ, born 18 February 1925, residing in Berlin/Neukoelln, Johasstrasse 40, was dropped without prejudice on 4 October 1948 by a SS intelligence agency in Germany.

BIFA-106, dated 19 September 1952:

K. SCHUTZ i. Plesse-Verlag, Goettingen, Felix Kleinstrasse 1, was included in a list of persons with whom Wilhelm KILFER had discussed his plans for the formation of a new Rightist Party. KILFER is suspected of working for the French IS.
