1. Subject individuals, German Intelligence representatives, at the invitation of this Agency, will be in Washington, D. C. from 10 September 1956 through 13 September 1956 to attend a number of briefings in Agency buildings.

2. A briefing on security matters by the Office of Security is scheduled for 13 September 1956.

3. So have been advised by Mr. [redacted] (ext. 4265) of [redacted] that the above individuals have been certified to by their parent government. Green list checks have been completed. CIA disclosures have been authorized through Top Secret when to the net advantage of the U. S. Government. However, no disclosures can or will be made of classified material originating in other government departments. Special Privilege Passes have been authorized and issued at the request of DC/P.

4. Current National Agency name checks have been partially completed. They are either negative or non-derogatory.

5. A previous record on Kurt H. Kohler reflects that Kohler is a former member of the Storm Troopers of the Nazi Party, that in 1951 the Agency requested issuance of a visa under an alias and that National Agency checks in 1951 were negative. Additional biographic data on the foreign visitors is attached hereto.

6. The above individuals are members of the same organization as General Von Mollenthin who was briefed by Office of Security on 25 and 26 April 1956. General Von Mollenthin's file is attached for your information.

7. In view of the above information there is an objection to releasing these individuals on security procedures. The extent of disclosure, in the opinion of the Policy Staff, should be governed by the policy set forth in memorandum dated 22 August 1955 (copy attached) from the Director of Security to Chief, USA with respect to release of similar data to the [redacted] government. Colonel Woods felt that disclosures with respect to equipment should be consistent with previous disclosures to similar personnel at Headquarters and in the field.
