He has slicked greyish hair, a grey complexion, was dressed severely in a double breasted suit, wears a wedding ring on his right hand, is a non-smoker, drinks little alcohol during the day, has a fine sense of humor, was an intelligence officer in Berlin during the war, is both a fine conversationalist and good listener, is often frustrated by bureaucratic administrative procedures, finds the preparation of UPSWING's 1961 budget in 1959 illogical, feels that the book Parkinson's Law is one of the best written recently, is badly harassed by travel regulations, was referred to as Oberst by his colleagues, is tolerant of his colleagues' operational operations when they do not agree with his own, appeared surprised that the other UPSWINGERS knew the details of a recent Berlin MFS defection case, is clear headed, intelligence, quick thinking and appears to be a highly qualified and experienced Headquarters officer.
