SUBJECT: Elizabeth LINK, Detroit

1. In her notebook maintained for the years 1940 through approximately 1950, UIDROWSY recorded the following name and address:

Mrs. EBERT  
Wielandstrasse 59  
bei ECKSTEIN

2. Without any doubt the Mrs. EBERT UIDROWSY had in mind is:

Frau Elizabeth LINK EBERT (widow) (born ECKSTEIN)  
DOB: 20 June 1917 in Dresden

Frau Elizabeth LINK was first married to Eric EBERT (born on 16 December 1917). Of this marriage their child, Angelika, was born on 22 July 1943 in Dresden. Eric EBERT was reported missing in World War II and declared legally dead on 31 July 1949 by the district court in Dresden.

3. Elizabeth EBERT moved with her daughter on 30 May 1949 from Dresden to Frankfurt/Main, taking up residence at Wielandstrasse 59, bei ECKSTEIN. In July 1949 she moved to Frankfurt/Main, Heinrich Tessenoweg 35.

4. Frau EBERT married again on 8 July 1952, a tool maker named Kurt LINK, resident of Frankfurt/Main, born on 23 March 1919 in Frankfurt/Main. LINK had returned to Frankfurt/Main in April 1949 from Soviet captivity (as a POW). The newly established LINK family moved their home in July 1952 to NEU-ISENBURG. On 20 October 1953 Kurt LINK emigrated to the U.S. His family followed him on 26 April 1954, giving notice of leaving for Detroit on the same day.

5. Frau Elizabeth LINK is probably a childhood acquaintance of UIDROWSY. Her notebook entry must have been made prior to July 1949, the time of the move to Heinrich Tessenoweg 35, and, accordingly, before the beginning of UIDROWSY's activities on behalf of the KGB. Information on the personal contact between UIDROWSY and Frau LINK during the post-war period is not available. It is therefore unlikely that she had any knowledge of his intelligence activity in behalf of the Soviet Intelligence Service. Nevertheless, CATIDE desires to announce her to the facts of the case.
