We then went into the UJDROWSY case a bit further and BERNHARDT stated that he was far from satisfied that the penetration problem had been solved with the disposal of UJDROWSY. He pointed out that the Soviets had gained certain info on the ~~xxxxxxx~~ mutual assistance program discussed between MLB and CATUSK and specifically items discussed in preparation for the UTILITY-ASCHAM meetings in 1956/57 which had not been known to UJDROWSY. He felt that an additional investigation of details and especially of the access various people had to fragments of the information would be ~~xxxxxx~~ necessary. We agreed to study these aspects of the matter together at a later time.

We reminded him of our previous talk on 5 January and he suggested that both he and @CASTROP would study the file and all three of us would then discuss the case. In that connection, he brought up the changes in MLB and asked [] whether [] was affected by the change. [] said he was not. He then expressed pleasure at the return of [] to MLB. He had obviously heard of it almost immediately upon his return from his trip.
