<p>1. As requested in reference, we passed the attachment to CATRIBE. Unexpectedly, we received a long reply from Alias BERNHARDT clarifying the statement in paragraph 4 of attachment to reference, that a West German file had come into the hands of the Securitate. Alias BERNHARDT's explanation follows in translation.</p> <p>2. "(dated 22 Dec 70) Subject: Alleged Soviet/Rumanian Access to West German Files (ca 1960)</p> <p>"We thank you for the information conveyed in reference.</p> <p>"Our investigations have led to the following result:</p> <p>"a. Members of the Rumanian I.S. Ciuciulin and Horobet were taken into investigative custody on 18 July 1958 by members of the Sicherungs gruppe and accused of having entered the Bundesrepublik on 13 July 1958 to perform intelligence assignments. (Refer to Report of Sicherungsgruppe ELII 454/58 Geheim, dated 11 Nov 58 and 9 Oct 58.)</p> <p>"b. CATRIBE assisted officially by providing a debriefer and a translator, both of whom participated in the interrogation of Subjects. CATRIBE was given access to the results of the debriefing. The Case was processed in CATRIBE under the code name "Fall MUFEISEN", and after evaluation by the Satellite CE shop was retired to central files.</p>

"c. From materials confiscated from UJDROWSY after his arrest on 6 November 61, we conclude:

"(1) Shortly before 18 Jan 60 UJDROWSY was making preparations for a lecture on 'Operational Practices of Eastern Intelligence Services,' which he gave to a large circle of listeners at CATRIBE Headquarters on that date.

"(2) It was also apparent that UJDROWSY in preparing for his talk had made careful notes including exact personality data from "Fall HUFEISEN"; in order to refer to this Case.

"(3) It is known that in order to prepare for his lecture, UJDROWSY freed himself from duty for one day, allegedly so that he could concentrate undisturbed at his house at (place).

"(4) Since UJDROWSY had not previously been involved in "Fall HUFEISEN", we conclude from the notes he had prepared that he had ordered the file from central files and took at least the important parts of it with him to (place).

"(5) Since he had there good technical means to copy files, it is highly probable that he photographed all the available files on "Fall HUFEISEN" and furnished them to the KGB.

"The BfV and SG-Bonn will be informed of the above by us.
