EXTRACT OF SEMI-MONTHLY OPERATIONS REPORT SCI MUNICH, 31 Aug 45

4. PENETRATION PROGRAM

Persons listed in this section of the report will be divided, with respect to the progress made in each case, into classifications "Agents Operating", "Proposed Agents" and "PA Possibilities". They will be further divided, with a view to their ultimate disposition, into categories of "Automatic CI Arrest" and "Other Categories".

A. AGENTS OPERATING

(1) AUTOMATIC CI ARREST CATEGORY

(a) JIGGER From information supplied by this agent, the Detachment was able to turn over intact, to the 579th U.S. Signal Depot Company, a German telephone central with four wheel trailer valued at 150,000 dollars.

JIGGER is still engaged in obtaining information from Leo BRANDT. A full report of BRANDT's past and present activities and those of his agents will be forwarded when the information is complete.

(b) OSTRICH See JIGGER

(c) IMPFFENBACH Difficulty is being experienced, because of his SS background, in placing this agent with the Arts and Monuments Section of Military Government. It is expected, however, that he will soon be found a job in the building trade with which he was formerly associated.

(d) FAMINE Approval to use this agent was received by this station on 18 August 1945.

On 28 August 1945 FAMINE returned from USFET, where for the past several weeks he has been collaborating in the work there. He was taken immediately to his home in Miesbach to reestablish himself in the community.

As a result of the preferential treatment which he received at USFET, his attitude is excellent. We may expect his fullest cooperation.

(e) VANDAL Approval to use this agent was received by this station on 18 August 1945.

On 25 August 1945 arrangements for the release of VANDAL were completed with the Third U.S. Army Intelligence Center. He was taken directly to Prien where he will establish residence with friends. At present he is obtaining the papers necessary for this residence.

(f) PIGEON Approval to use this agent was received by the detachment on 18 August 1945. Arrangements for his release from the Third U.S. Army Intelligence Center have been completed and he is presently established at Bis-marckstr. 28, MUNICH.

PIGEON's personal funds have been impounded in a blocked account by the Property Control Officer, Reichsbank, Augsburg, and efforts are now being made to place him somehow in the field of education so that he may be self-supporting.

PIGEON has given us information concerning the whereabouts and future plans of FRIEDRICH, the "Stellvertreter" of the NSDAP secretary, BORMANN. Details were the subject of our cable No. 191 of 27 August 1945.

PIGEON also reports the existence of an ultra radical communist organization, "Roter Lowe", which presumably maintains close contact with and receives regular communications and instructions from the Russian Occupied Zone. Since, as a contributor to the "Sozial Pazifist" in Dusseldorf, PIGEON was once known for his communistic leanings, he may be in a position to contact members of this organization and learn its true nature.

(g) HERRING Approval to use this agent was received by the detachment on 18 August 1945.

At the time when his use was approved, HERRING was transferred from Third U.S. Army Intelligence Center to house arrest in Vilshofen, Nieder Bayern, to work, on behalf of the EDS of the IC, on some fifty tons of documents of the Reichskommissar für die Festigung deutschen Volkstums.

Pending a regular job for HERRING in Vilshofen, he will remain at his work for EDS in which he has demonstrated his willingness to cooperate fully and to work long hours.
