PART II - OPERATIONAL INFORMATION

- 36. Not yet assigned
- 37. CASTONE-4 under Provost Marshall cover first contacted Subject on 5 December 1958 at the Registrar's office at the University of Munich. At the time of recruitment, CASTONE-4 indicated that he was engaged in special investigations for the Provost Marshall which had to do with drug addiction and smuggling problems. CASTONE-4 indicated confidentially to Subject that certain clues led to individuals posing as foreign students in Munich schools who were involved in drug traffic and therefore CASTONE-4 was interested in a direct and confidential contact in the Registrar's office of the University. Subject has apparently accepted CASTONE-4's story and has agreed to cooperate in any way possible.
- 38. Subject has to date been contacted exclusively by CASTONE-4. No plans have yet been formulated to turn Subject over to a KUBARK staffer. The present case officer will, however, instruct CASTONE-4 to prepare a letter of introduction to Subject which will be used at such time when emergency takeover is necessary.
- 39. Subject's motivation at this stage of development appears to be primarily that of monetary gain. Subject receives a sum of money whenever he provides us with desired information. Since his salary from his regular employment is comparatively moderate, Subject more than welcomes the bonuses he receives from us. According to CASTONE-4, Subject has also been led to believe that he is cooperating with a law enforcement agency of the U.S. Government and in this respect may feel that his cooperation is considered helpful in prevention of crime.

41. Control over Subject appears to be primarily monetary inducement. He has, however, turned over to CASTONE-4 restricted University foreign student logs in his own handwriting, which we have photocopied. CASTONE-4 has indicated that Subject has over extended his cooperation with a U.S. Service by giving us these catalogs and would possibly be in danger of losing his job at the University if this fact were to be discovered by his employer.
42. Subject has been informed that he is cooperating with the Provost Marshal of the U.S. Army in Munich. He believes his information aids in special investigations conducted by the Provost Marshal in the field of drug addiction possibly leading to or involving members of the Armed Forces.
43. None known
44. Subject has furnished handwritten logs on the foreign student enrollment at the University of Munich. He has also procured the restricted catalog containing student listings of the Technical Hoch Schule of Munich. Subject has also supplied CASTONE-4 with pass-size photographs of students enrolled at the University. Basic biographical data on students has been checked with police records by CASTONE-4 and has checked out to be correct.
45. For the immediate future Subject's services will be limited to the activities stated in 44 above.
46. Subject has not been given any special training. He has been cautioned by CASTONE-4 to keep the relationship confidential.
47. Information obtained by Subject is under his direct control as Registrar of the University of Munich.
48. Subject has received a bonus payment of DM 200 whenever he has turned over student listings. No regular salary is contemplated.
49. No promises or commitments have been made to Subject other than our assurance that we would handle information received from him in a discreet and confidential manner.
50. Possibly could pass as an Austrian.
51. Lower middle class.

52. Little is known about Subject's personal habits except what CASTONE-4 has observed during occasional meetings of relatively short duration. CASTONE-4 does not believe that Subject has an alcohol problem nor does Subject give the impression that he is a victim of drug addiction or any other excessive habit. Subject appears to CASTONE-4 to be well adjusted, sober and happily married.
53. Subject has thus far proven to be reliable and discreet in his relationships with CASTONE-4. He has never demanded payment for his services and apparently considers any "bonus" we may give him pure gratuity. It is to Subject's interest to deal with CASTONE-4 in a secure manner since the extent of his cooperation with CASTONE-4 has overstepped normal bounds and if discovered could probably threaten his present employment at the University. CASTONE-4 has the impression that Subject is presently politically indifferent, however, he has expressed anti-Communist sympathies and appears to be definitely pro-West in his general outlook.
54. As a citizen of West Germany, Subject would most likely cooperate with a West German service.
