(F-6 EVALUATION)</p> <p>SERGEJ ORLOFF IS MENTIONED IN DOSSIER 75981. ACCORDING TO OTHER SOURCES, HE WAS AT ONE TIME, A CONFIDENTIAL MAN OF HEINRICH HIMMLER WITH THE ROA.
