| | <p>The following extract from a 6 March 1963 Contact Report is FOB's contribution to your knowledge of the activities of fnu DENDEN:</p> <p><i>Algerian Contacts D-PARIS</i></p> <p>a. In Paris on INTERPOL business on 29 January CARAVEL met his Swiss friend Francois GENOUD who is still an agent for the Algerian government, and, as CARAVEL now firmly believes, for WHITII as well. GENOUD said the Algerian Ministry of Interior was still interested in CARAVEL's help and advice in police matters. This conversation was followed up in mid February by a visit to the CAMEN office by GENOUD with an Algerian police officer named fnu DENDEN in tow. GENOUD brought a letter from fnu YUSFI, Chief of the Algerian Security Service, YUSFI wrote that he was happy to take up contact with CARAVEL through GENOUD and would welcome a visit from CARAVEL. He also asked if CARAVEL would give communications training to his man, DENDEN.</p> <p>b. CARAVEL wrote back that he would be happy to visit the Algerian Security Service in April, but that a request for the services of CAMEN had better come through diplomatic channels. He stipulated that if DENDEN was to be given police communications training he would have to learn some German before he came and then take an intensive three month course at the Goethe Institute before the CAMEN 4 to 6 months training could begin. Meanwhile, CARAVEL has checked out the Algerian requests with his Ministry in Bonn and received approval in principle.</p> <p>c. CARAVEL has been invited to participate as police expert in a United Nations "Technical Assistance Mission to the Middle East and African Countries" which is to "consult with the governments on problems of narcotics control." The commission will start in Morocco on 1 September 1962 and after also visiting Algeria, Tunis, Lebanon, Syria, Iraq, Iran, Turkey and Israel, it will write its final report on Cyprus on 13 October 1963.</p> <p>d. CARAVEL's participation is sponsored by INTERPOL and though the job is a dreary one, CARAVEL has accepted because it is in the interest of INTERPOL to have a senior man visiting the Arab countries. You will note that Egypt (UAR) is not on the list. CARAVEL states that the UAR is trying to organize a pan-Arab INTERPOL or at least a pan-Arab pressure group to influence INTERPOL affairs, and missions such as CARAVEL's will have the effect of neutralizing the UAR efforts. CARAVEL claims that the United Nations motives in sending the narcotics commission are identical with those of INTERPOL.</p> | | |
