1. The case files of Subjects have been with the Consulate General, Munich for quite some time. Reportedly, there is no change as to their current emigration status. This Consulate is still awaiting a final screening report from IRP in Stuttgart. To the best of the Vice Consul's knowledge there appear to be no complications which might militate against the issuance of a visa for emigration, unless, of course, the IRP issues an unfavorable or derogatory screening report.

2. Attached hereto please find an extract of some data pertaining to the status of their emigration processing.

3. If you desire, we can follow the case here, and receive notification of arrival of the IRP report.



Status of Subject's application - Awaiting final IRP.

- 1947 - Subject applied for immigration to U.S. through National Catholic Welfare Conference at Ludwigsburg, Germany. Received his Visa in Sept. 1949.
- 21 Sep 1949 - Subject was rejected for immigration for unknown reason by IRO Officials. Subject believes this might have been due to his former membership in the Lithuanian Security Police.
- 8 May 1950 - Subject was declared not to be within the mandate of IRO according to the decision of International Refugee Organization at Geneva.
- 27 Mar 1951 - Above decision cancelled by same organization upon request of Subject.
- Apr 1951 - Subject again applied for immigration to U.S. through NCWC at Ludwigsburg (Resettlement Center). He was informed that application had been cancelled due to the expiration of the DP portion of the Displaced Persons Act of 1948, as amended.
- Jan 1951 - Subject also applied for immigration to U.S. through American Consulate at Stuttgart under Polish Quota. Received Quota No. 2171. American Consulate at Munich advised Subject he would either have to immigrate under the Polish Quota or this Refugee Program. Subject decided in favor of Refugee Relief Act Program.
- 1 Jan 1952 - Status of Subject's case was held in review file in Security Section.
- 28 Nov 1955 - Deferred med. because of TB.
- 23 Mar 1955 - Ltr. to NCWC in N.Y. stating that Subject was found inadmissible to the U.S. under Section 212(a)(6) of I&N Act of 1952, and processing of case has been discontinued.

Employment with Lithuanian Security Police:

- 16 Dec 1931 - Subject voluntarily joined the Lith. Security Police at Kaunas.
- 1931-1933 - Subject was employed as an official.
- 1933-1940 - Subject was District Chief of Alytus, Lithuania.
- 27 Jul 1940 - Subj. was arrested by Russian NKVD after Lith. was occupied by Russian Forces. He was kept as a political prisoner at Kaunas until 24 June 1941, when he was set free by Lith. partisans who rose against Bolshevistic Regime in Lith.

After the Lith. Gov't was established, Subject was summoned to rejoin the Lith. Security Police.

1 Jul 41 - Apr 1944 - Served with Lith. Security Police.

Anti-Nazi resistance:

When Lith. was occupied by German Forces, Subject took active part in the Lith. Anti-Nazi resistance. Approximately on 26 Jul 1944 Subject was compelled to do forced labor, building dug outs for German Forces at Elbing, near Danzig. Then Subj. was sent to Gottenhafen, Danzig, from where he was brought by transport to Neumarkt, Bavaria, Germany, where he arrived on 25 August 1944. On 6 Sep. 1944 Subj. left Neumarkt to work at Aluminum Plant "Inselwerk" Caustadt near Bamberg, as a forced laborer.

Organizations:

Subject was a member of the illegal Lith. Anti-Nazi Resistance from 1 Jul 1941 to Aug 1944. This organization was a semi-military underground organization with the aim to fight for an independent Lith. Subject's duties were to get information from the Nazis and to supply weapons to the underground.

Employment from 1 June 1952 to present -

- 1 June 1952 - 31 Dec 1952 - Employer for home work with <sup>U. Firm - Uger</sup> University Publishing House, (Dr) Peter ~~HELEY~~, 23 Ayingerstr., Munich 8. (Quit due to shortage of work)
- 31 Dec 1952 - 31 Oct 1955 - Representative for Wuerttemberg for firm (Dr) ~~PROKSSER & CO.~~, 11 Schoenfelderstr., Munich 22. (Discharged due to organizational changes)
- 31 Oct 1955 - Present Unemployed.

Subject was disqualified for emigration under Section 212(a)(6) of Public Law 414 due to X-Ray examination discovery that Kazis OIMCZUSKAS has Pulmonary Tuberculosis Class A-II, as of February 8, 1955.

Subject was found qualified upon re-submission of X-Ray on 25 January 1956.
